1. 37th IABSE Symposium, Madrid 2014

Update: The IABSE Symposium 'Engineering for Progress, Nature and People' will be held from Sept. 3-5, 2014. The title has found great response: the Scientific Committee has reviewed over 750 abstracts submitted from 60 countries. The Technical Programme will embrace three days, and the technical sessions will also include sessions arranged by particular Technical Groups of IABSE, focusing on specific subjects relevant to their activities within the theme of the Symposium. Furthermore: special sessions will be devoted to notable current projects and themes, and technical visits to buildings, construction sites and projects of special interest will be organised.

Germany - the German Group of IABSE organised its first Young Engineers Colloquium in Dresden 2014 on March 10, 2014. This event enabled undergraduate and graduate students to present their current work and young engineers from practice to present their first construction projects. Klaus Ostenfeld, former CEO of COWI and past President of IABSE (1997-2001), gave a talk about the challenges and opportunities in international bridge construction. 35 young Engineers and engineers presented their submitted papers and posters in oral and poster presentations, which were accompanied by stimulating discussions. The diversity of participants from various fields of civil engineering and the combination of English and German as presentation language were amongst other one of the appeals of this first colloquium. The conference will also emphasise the technologies
